

KIWANIS ONE DAY PROJECT

We met on the 26th of April, also, to package foods for an organization called *Kids Against Hunger*. We did this project in conjunction with our local Kiwanis club, the Rotary Club, the Salvation Army, and other local Key Clubs. Now, this project was not conducted on the common day (April 5th, but that would be because we were preparing for DCON at the time).

Our club was one of the earliest there, as John Gong was there as early as some of the Kiwanians setting up (9:00 am). Most members, including myself, arrived shortly after 10:00 am. There we were greeted by a host of powders, people, bananas, and boxes! It looked really scary, like some sort of freak fortress!

In the first shift, I worked on pouring powder into a little siphon. At first, it was boring. But, as I talked with others, I heard stories, about past projects... about people in the community, and gradually, it became easy for me to keep working. Once the first shift

ended at 12:00 pm, it was quite interesting.

During the second shift, I took a change of position. I started by packaging units of 36 meals, but I got bored and I decided to do more! I first started packaging the boxes that no one was closing with tape. And then we saw what was needed, and we started breaking into groups to help others with re-supplying rice and protein and vegetables. We made multiple meals that day, and we actually stopped early, only because we ran out of ingredients!

As I know now, we have packaged 18,732 meals or so for emergency situations around the world! It is amazing to know that we did so much!
